

## Regina Public Library welcomes author Michelle Good

Regina Public Library (RPL), in partnership with First Nations University of Canada (FNUC) and the Saskatchewan Library Association (SLA), will host a talk by author Michelle Good at 7:00pm on Wednesday, April 12 at māmawêyatitân centre, 3355 6th Avenue.

Nelson Bird, CTV Regina News assignment editor and former Indigenous Circle anchor, reporter, and producer will interview Good about her award-winning debut novel, *Five Little Indians*, which has been selected by the SLA as its [One Book One Province](#) title for 2023.

"*Five Little Indians* was one of our most-read titles in 2022," said Millicent Mabi, Director of Community Engagement and Programming. "We're so pleased to have this opportunity to connect our readers with Michelle, so they can learn more about her work and her lived experience."

Paula Daigle, University Librarian at First Nations University agrees. "We love being able to support a Saskatchewan First Nations author, especially one who has written about the difficult transitions of individuals after Residential Schools. This is an important area to talk about and understand. Michelle does a stellar job."
