Major solo exhibition by acclaimed Indigenous artist Judy Anderson comes to Dunlop Art Gallery

Dunlop Art Gallery is proud to announce the opening of new solo exhibition ...Indigenized by nêhiyaw (Cree) artist Judy Anderson.

After more than two decades of creating artistic interventions to claim her place in the world, Judy Anderson will present new work in her first major solo exhibition in Regina. An immersive multi-sensory experience, the exhibition ...Indigenized, invites viewers into the gallery to see, smell, and hear the shared teachings of nêhiyaw people. Anderson's characteristic serious-yet-playful artwork will challenge viewers to question what it means to "Indigenize" a place.

Judy Anderson is from Gordon First Nation, Treaty 4, Saskatchewan. She completed her MFA from University of Regina in 2008 and is currently a professor at the University of Calgary.

"Judy Anderson's exceptional career as a visual artist speaks to the continued artistic excellence of our community," said Director/Curator, Dunlop Art Gallery, Alyssa Fearon. "We are excited to welcome Judy home to Regina to inspire us through multiple senses."

The opening reception for ...Indigenized takes place Friday, April 14, 7:00pm at Dunlop Art Gallery (Central Library). Judy Anderson will provide an artist talk followed by a performance with artist-collaborator Audie Murray, inaugural City of Regina Indigenous Artist in Residence.

The exhibition runs until June 21 at Dunlop Art Gallery (Central Library).
